Guide to The Day reading levels

Reading levels are based on seven popular readability formulas: *Flesch Reading Ease formula; Flesch-Kincaid Grade Level; Fog Scale; SMOG Index; Coleman-Liau Index; Automated Readability Index; Linsear Write Formula.* These formulas work by analysing the text and calculating the number of sentences, words, syllables and characters.
